



Mr Bill Dale Muns

September 9, 1932 - January 22, 2015

Bill D. Muns of El Campo, died January 22, 2015 at The Medical Center in Houston, Tx at the age of 82. He was born on September 9, 1932 at Enid, Oklahoma to Dale William and Helen Louise Willett Muns.

He graduated from Neosho Falls, Kansas High School in 1951 and served from 1951 to 1955 in the United States Air Force. Three years of that time was spent at Rhein Main Air Force base near Frankfurt, Germany.

In 1955 he married his high school sweetheart, Nelda Ann Dutton in the Methodist Episcopal Church in Neosho Falls, Kansas. He graduated from Sam Houston State University in 1961 and had additional graduate hours from the University of Maryland and the University of Houston.

He began his teaching career at Garwood High School. Later at Rice Consolidated High School in Altair and in 1974 became the Vocational Office Education Coordinator at El Campo High School. He retired in 1989 and taught at St. Philip's School in El Campo from 1989 to 1990. During his entire teaching career he also taught evening and summer school classes for Wharton Junior College.

He was a member and Chairman of the Wharton County Junior College Board of Trustees, a 32 year member of the Wharton County Teachers Credit Union Board of Directors, a member of the Heritage Center Board of Directors, a member of the Wharton County Retired Teachers, Booster Clubs of E.C.H.S., and W.C.J.C. and the American Legion Post 251, a life member of S.H.S.U. Alumni and the South West Basketball Officials Association. He also worked

with the Boy Scouts, Little League, and was a tennis coach.

He was an active member of the First United Methodist Church of El Campo Where through the years he had been a Sunday School Teacher, head usher, member of the Methodist Men, sang in the sanctuary choir, and served on many boards and commissions. He was Chairman of the Building Committee for the renovation of the sanctuary in 2010.

He is survived by his wife, Nelda Ann of 59 years and their son, William Randolph (Randy) of Chico, TX. Also by grandchildren, Matthew and wife Sarah of South Lake, TX; Anne Hartfield and husband Bradley of Grand Prairie, TX; Dr. Amanda Muns of Dallas, TX; also John Randolph Muns of Chico, TX.

Also great grandchildren Genevieve Hartfield, Elizabeth Muns, Julian Hartfield, and Theodore Muns.

He is also survived by half-brothers George Muns and wife Velma of Las Vegas, Nevada and Gary Muns of Bloomfield, New Mexico; and half sister Deborah and husband Ron Talcott of Durango, Colorado; brother-in-law Thayne Dutton and wife Rosa Lee of Sugar Land; nieces Michelle Granberry and husband Kent of Sugar Land, Tracey Teltschik and husband Jim of Houston; nephew Shayne Dutton and wife Michelle of Fort Worth and great nephews John Everett and Blake Teltschik of Houston and Chandler Dutton of Fort Worth.

He was preceded in death by his parents, grandson Luke Richard Muns, step mother Garnett Muns, and nephew Levi Muns.

Visitation will begin on Monday, January 26, 2015 at 2:00PM with the family receiving friends from 5-6PM at Triska Funeral Home. Funeral services will be at 10:00AM on Tuesday, January 27, 2015 at the First United Methodist Church with Rev. Sheldon Williams officiating. Burial will follow at the Garden of Memories Cemetery.

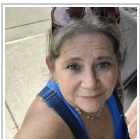
