Edith Marie Naiser passed away on March 13, 2021, three weeks shy of her 97th birthday. She was born on April 9, 1924, in Taiton, Wharton County, Texas to the late Cecilia and Edward R. Naiser.

Edith is also preceded in death by sisters Beatrice Stanford and Alice Rodgers, and niece Joan Lorehn.
