



## Edward F. Dornak

December 11, 1918 - November 21, 2012

Edward F. Dornak, of Blessing, Texas, passed away November 21, 2012 at the age of 93. He was born in Gonzales, Texas, on December 11, 1918 to Method and Mary Lizner Dornak. Edward moved to the Blessing area in 1930 and was a farmer, rancher and carpenter. On February 8, 1944 he married his wife of 68 years, Tillie Vaculin Dornak. He was a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church in Blessing and served as a Eucharistic Minister and was on the church council. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus #4307, Catholic Workmen and SPJST.
