Jimmy Lynn Roehl went to be with our Lord on Sunday, November 23, 2025, after a courageous battle with cancer, with his son, Blake, and his daughter-in-law, Cameron, by his side. Jimmy was born on October 28, 1952, to the late Allen and Lucille Roehl in El Campo. He was the middle child of three.

Jimmy graduated from El Campo High School in 1971. He was then drafted into the United States Army, where he served for two years. Upon being discharged, he began working at Texaco in 1974, where he worked for 21 years. Jimmy retired in 1995 when Texaco was bought out by Apache Corporation. He then began working for Apache Corporation in 1995 until his retirement in 2012. Afterward, Blake and Jimmy started Diamond R Services, LLC in 2012, where together they ran an oilfield lease service for 10 years. Jimmy had two children, Ashley Roehl and Blake Roehl. He was a father-in-law to Cameron Roehl and a proud "PoPo" to three grandchildren, Brody, Ruby, and Broc, whom he loved with all his heart. Jimmy took joy in spoiling them with endless oatmeal cookies, suckers, and Jolly Ranchers to fill their pockets every day before supper.

Jimmy spent much of his time fishing at Schicke Point in "Little Red" or checking on his cattle. If he wasn't fishing or being a cowboy, he could be found watching his grandchildren's many activities or visiting them daily to hear about their school day. He loved the outdoors, whether hunting, fishing,

working cattle, cutting firewood, or simply sitting by a fire enjoying a tall glass of R&R. He cherished the friendships he built over the years and will be missed by all.

Jimmy is survived by his son, Blake, and wife, Cameron; his daughter, Ashley Roehl; his grandchildren, Brody, Ruby, and Broc; his brother, Kenny Roehl, and wife, Sheryl; and many other family members.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Allen and Lucille Roehl and his sister, Denise Franklin.

The family will be having a Celebration of Life on Thursday, December 4, 2025, beginning at 10:00 a.m. at The Mill, 605 South Street, Louise, TX 77455.
