Leona Rod Kasper Finley of Hillje, formerly of Richmond and Ganado, died December 28, 2012 at the age of 81. She was born January 11, 1931 in Blue Creek Community to the late Charles and Millie Socha Rod. She and her first husband John Kasper, Jr. owned and operated Hillje Grocery and Market from 1952 – 1970 and the Ganado Dairy Market from 1970 – 1993. She was a member of the KJZT and formerly a member of the Ganado CDA.

She is survived by her husband J. Finley of Richmond; sons Rusty Kasper, her side-kick and favorite companion, Mark Kasper and wife Chris of Brazoria and John Kasper, and wife Cynthia "Jo" of Sweeny; 7 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren.
