Margie Lee Schoenfield Wiesner, 83, of El Campo, passed away on June 4, 2014. She was born on December 28, 1930 at the home of her grandmother Daisy in Old Taiton, Texas to Leo William Schoenfield and Douglas Richter Schoenfield.

She was a graduate of El Campo High School. She was a homemaker and a bookkeeper for Wiesner Farms. She met the Love of her life, Victor, at Taiton Dance Hall. Their first dance together was "The Blue Skirt Waltz" and Margie was wearing a blue skirt. It became "their song." She married Victor Martin Wiesner on October 11, 1949 in St. Philip Catholic Church. They were married for 55 years until Victor preceded her to heaven. She was a devoted, loving, and kind wife, mother, grandmother, and great grandmother. She was affectionately known to her grandchildren as Mimi.
