Raymond V. Korenek of Nada passed away December 17, 2020 at the age of 84. He was born in Colorado County on January 22, 1936 to the late Adolph and Justina Janish Korenek. He was a life-long rice farmer as well a water well driller, grain dryer operator, and a cotton gin operator. He was proud of his Texas A & M certification in cotton buying. He served both his industry and community through memberships in American Rice Assoc. as past director, and RVOS Lodge #23 and KJT Society # 34 as past-presidents. He received the Go Texan Award and Colorado County Citizen of the Year. He also served his parish community as a member of St. Mary's Church Board and St. Mary's School Board. He was an active member of the Nada Knights of Columbus Council #3371. His great faith led him to a long-time devotion to St. Mary's Eucharistic Adoration. He had a life-long devotion to the Blessed Mother and lead the Rosary every Monday for end to abortion and for our servicemen for many years. Every morning he went and did social hour at Nada Grocery with his buddies.
