



## Thelma B. Sunday Weinheimer

September 5, 1911 - July 31, 2011

Thelma B. Sunday Weinheimer of El Campo died July 31, 2011 at the age of 99. She was born on September 5, 1911 in Glen Flora to the late Roland Eugene and Nora Find Sunday. She received her high school diploma in El Campo. On October 7, 1934, she married Dr. E. A. Weinheimer, Sr. in Norman, OK. They resided in El Campo, where they continued their medical practice.
